ENCOURAGES STUDENTS TO ACTIVE LEARNING

It explores how we can get more effective learning experiences, by giving the students opportunities to apply, analyze and synthesize their prior knowledge. Research has shown that 'active learning, student-centered approaches to teaching physiology work, and they work better than more passive learning' (Joel Michael, 2006). So in this context, encourages students' active participation through music integration in the classroom.

ENCOURAGES READINESS TO LEARN

The learning readiness of the students is the prerequisite condition for an effective learning process. According to **Thorndike** (1989), the law of readiness is the first primary law of learning which means that learning takes place when any action trend is arouses through interest and curiosity. Researches show the 'high level of influence in educational achievement due to learning readiness among school students' (**R**. **Dongal, M. Shrestha, 2019**). Researches show that music has the potential to prepare students' readiness to learn activities.

MOTIVATES STUDENTS TO LEARN

Learning is a continuous process that needs to be purposefully guided and motivated to achieve desired outcomes for the students. Learning must be affected by motivation so that the students are engaged with the learning process and progress in their education. Motivation works like oxygen to enhance learning. Students were more motivated and eager to participate in the activities when songs were used in their classes. The perceptions of the students and teachers were similar (**Şener, S. & Erkan, D, 2018**).

STIMULATES STUDENTS TO LEARN NEW CONCEPTS

If we think about a boring classroom in which any student is not interested in classroom activities. But instead of this, in a stimulated classroom students quickly



engaged with the new concepts. That's why; music helps children learn new concepts and ideas.

STUDENTS STAY ENGAGED IN THE CLASSROOM

Children's attention does not fix on one task, they are diverted and fickle. An effective teaching approach plays a significant role in this situation. That's why music integrated teaching's importance increases because it keeps the children engaged in the learning process.

STUDENTS CAN LEARN TEAMWORK AND COORDINATION

Man is a social animal and education is a tool that guided man on how to live in society, so in this way, the process of socialization of the children starts in a classroom. Teamwork and coordination can be easily taught to children in a joyful and engaged classroom. Students easily learn teamwork and coordination through musical activities.

INCULCATE SOCIAL VALUES

Being a mother, I am also experiencing that children learn easily manners and discipline through exposure to music. Music integration with the teaching-learning process in the kindergarten will help social values such as love-tolerance, respect, responsibility, cooperation-helping, and courtesy Öztürk, E., & Can A, A., (2020).

IMPROVE STUDENTS' MEMORY AND ATTENTION

In the above points, we saw that effective learning of children requires a certain level of memory power and attention. When we teach effectively than students automatically pay attention and enhance their memory. Music encourages multisensory learning; According to NCF-2009 art integrated teaching approach is most effective rather than the disciplinary method of teaching. Research shows music can enhance memory and attention, according to **B. Shivakumar, 2013** exposure to classical Carnatic instrumental music has significantly enhanced scholastic achievement, memory, and attention of students.

RELEASE TENSION AND STRESS

We all know very well, that when we suffer stress then started listening to music, and then the magic happens. A stress-free mind will always enhance learning capacity. If the pandemic has taught us anything, it is that children's and adolescents' mental health is profoundly affected by their surroundings and circumstances – their experiences with parents and caregivers, their friendships, and how they play, learn and grow (UNICEF's the state of the world's children 2021).



AUXILIARY FOR INCLUSIVE CLASS

The therapeutic value of music itself becomes crucial for children with special needs. Recent studies reported that music therapy has a positive impact on students with required special instructional attention and guidance. Music therapy contributes to cognitive, psychosocial, and academic development. It provided practical guidelines to use music to accommodate children with disabilities (**Susan Sze & Sanna Yu**)

IMPROVE LANGUAGE COMPETENCIES

Language is essential for communication. The development of language is rapid during the early development of the child. Several studies have suggested that intensive musical training enhance children's linguistic skill. Music has the potential to enhance phonemic awareness, reading abilities, and language skills (**Benz S**, **Sellaro R, Hommel B & Colzato LS,2016**)

MAKE IT EASY TO LEARN MATH AND SCIENCE

Many researchers have reported the potential relation between music and mathematical skill and scientific concepts. We also see around us how children easily learn scientific and mathematical skills through rhymes and kids' songs. Separate musical training helps children learn math and science (Hua Yang, Weiyi Ma, Diankun Gonz, Jiehui Hu, & Dezhong Ya,2014).

CHALLENGES OF MUSIC INTEGRATION IN THE CLASSROOM

Any type of integration in the teaching-learning process is better rather than the disciplinary method of teaching. As we know the music integrated teaching promotes child psychology, individual differences of the students, a joyful learning environment, cooperative learning, child-centered learning, and a stress-free learning climate. Nevertheless, there are some challenges faced in the integration of music effectively in the classroom. The considerable challenges are outlined below-

LACK OF RESOURCES

For any institution to run successfully, it's mandatory to have resources such as funds, human resources, infrastructure, etc. According to **World Bank, on 28 June 2022**, present time countries prioritized health and social security spending over education at the outset of the pandemic and now additional aid is being directed towards mitigating the consequences of the war in Ukraine and other crises. Approximately 41 percent of lower-income countries reduced their spending on education after the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, with an average decline in spending of 13.5 percent. In this view, we can say resources are the major obstacles in the path of researching and implementing any innovative ideas.



LACK OF AWARENESS AMONG TEACHERS & PARENTS

Due to the lack of awareness, even in the present time, new teaching approaches are not used at all the schools in remote areas in developing countries. Even in the present times, education in such developing countries is seen as a mere quorum.

THE RIGIDNESS OF TEACHERS & PARENTS

If the above challenge is tackled but teachers' and parents' attitude is not ready to accept any changes then this type of innovative teaching idea is of no use. Sometimes schools lead to bring such a change but it's not possible because of the resistance attitude of teachers and parents.

LACK OF COORDINATION BETWEEN SCHOOL MANAGEMENT & EXECUTIVE BODY

For any educational implementation, there must be coordination between school management and executive bodies. Even stakeholders have to implement such a new approaches of teaching, then the school management does not reconcile with them so that's the big challenge to the any type of integration and innovation.

LACK OF MUSIC INTEGRATED TEACHING PROGRAM

Even though the national curriculum framework-2009 has suggested art-integrated teaching which emphasizes learning through real-life examples, musical activity, and drama. In this context, it becomes important to integrate music with teaching approaches.

SUGGESTIONS

We should try to minimize some of the challenges of this; we need to pay attention to the following-

- To increase the educational budget and provide proper resources to educational organizations.
- To motivate and aware the working teachers and parents for using music integrated teaching.
- To organize multiple workshops, seminars, awareness programs, and discussion forums to integrate art and music with teaching methodology.
- To promote music-integrated teaching during the period of internship of prospective teachers. So that, they will be comfortable using it.
- To encourage working teachers for conducting action research on the new approaches of teaching methodology.



- To motivate executive bodies to improve their coordinating skill with the management.
- To encourage and promote research in the field of teaching methodology.
- To encourage teacher educators, policymakers, and prospective teachers that they should adopt new teaching methodologies from international countries.

CONCLUSION

This paper focuses on music integrating with teaching practices in the classroom by giving the students a new way to educate their skills. Encouraging teachers to adopt a new method of teaching in the classroom and use music to enhance their transaction of learning content and modify their teaching skills.
