BOLLYWOOD POP AND ROMANTIC BALLADS

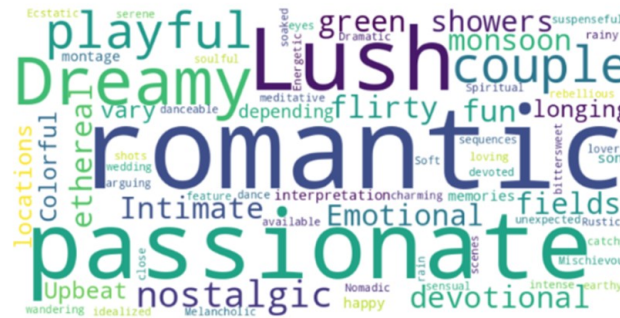
